Dear author,

for the preparation of your paper for the edaWorkshop document templates in Word and LaTeX have been created. These templates ensure a consistent look and make your work easier by automatically maintaining the heading styles, breaks and distances. In addition to the templates you will be provided by this writing guide. Please follow to the instructions very carefully in order to contribute to a homogenous form of the proceedings. This document is also an example of a written paper for the edaWorkshop.

1 Submission of a paper

Please submit your paper as a 5-6 pages (in German or English) PDF-file (without authors' names!) online by www.edacentrum.de/edaworkshop/upload up to **December 13, 2010**.

2 Technical notes

The file has to be create in A4 format (21 cm x 29.7 cm) and will be submitted as PDF. The type area must be centered. A width of 16 cm and a height of 24 cm and 2.5 cm margin on the right and left of each side shall be strictly observed. Page numbers on the sides are not allowed. The Times font has to be used. The font size for the text and the individual titles must be corresponding to the document templates at www.edacentrum.de/edaworkshop.

2.1 Graphics

Graphics must be created in black and white. Photographs should be scanned with 200 dpi or more. PowerPoint graphics should be avoided if possible. Graphics and photos must be embedded in the document.

2.2 Document protection and rights

The document has to be delivered without any file protection.

It is important to ensure that all fonts are embedded.

3 Content information

The sections should be ordered by the decimal numeration system (as done in this writing guide).

Images, photos and tables must be referenced in the text for at-least once, bold when they are first mentioned, for example, **Figure 2.3** or **Table 5.2**. Do not block or underline emphasized statements in the text, please use *italic* or **bold** letters.

References to literature should be labeled by numbers in square brackets, eg [7]. The references have to be summarized by a literature list at the end of the manuscript and not separately enclosed as footnotes.

Authors are asked to pay attention to standardized representation and presentation. Hints are given in the following (German only) DIN pocket books:

- No. 22: units and definitions for physical quantities
 - No. 202: symbols - typesetting - Mathematic signs and concepts
 - No. 514: Standards on Graphical Symbols for Electrical Engineering - Circuit symbols
- and IEC guidelines:
- IEC 27, IEC 50, IEC 375 and the
 - IEC Multilingual Dictionary of the Electricity, Electronics and Telecommunications

and each of the relevant ISO standards.
